

July 14, 15 Christina Cooper's Wool Applique pillow top -\$5 workshop + 10 wool kit + \$5 optional lunch


Times for workshops are Fridays 5pm to 9 pm and Saturday 9-5, unless otherwise noted.

Fri, March 24 5-9 and Sat, March 25 9-5 Workshop \$7 Optional lunch \$5 Finished size 38" x 48" Limit 20

Materials 1/3 yard of 6 different colors Scissors- one pair for cutting paper and one for cutting material A pen that erases with water Lots of pins Scotch tape Rotary cutter with a fresh blade Basic sewing supplies: sewing machine, bobbins, rulers, etc. Backing fabric 1 ½ yard Binding 3/8th yard

There are 3 sizes of wood for you to choose from and 6 different designs. You paint your own Wood Barn Quilt wall hanging, with outdoor paints. There are multiple colors to select, day of.

You do need to bring a blow dryer and your own beverages for the day.

ALL FEES MUST BE PAID NO LATER THAN APRIL 1, 2023. The payment is to be via check, made out to Stitchers Quilt Guild., <u>No exceptions</u>

2' X 2' is \$65

3' X 3' is \$125

4' X 4' is \$185

If unable to attend workshop on May 6th, there are 3 possible solutions.

1) you drive to Elizabeth's studio in Tennessee, at your expense and paint there, when she's available.

2) Make arrangements with Elizabeth for her to paint your barn wood and have her mail it to you. You pay shipping

3) Money is non refundable

Jelly Roll Rugs with Sara Medina, of Redwood City, CA

Friday, April 21 5 pm – 9pm and Saturday, April 22 9-3 Workshop \$10 or \$15 with optional Saturday lunch

To make one oval 30" x 44" rug or one 38" round rug you will need:

One Jelly Roll 40 - 42 fabric strips 2 1/2" x WOF

1 ¼ yards of 100% cotton batting 96" wide cut into 2 1/2"strips OR
1700" roll of batting strips. Any brand will do. They usually come in two sizes ~25 yard roll = 900" so you will need two OR
~50 yard roll = 1800" so you will need one

Non starch ironing spray such as Mary Ellen's I Hate Ironing **OR** Best Press

Any sewing machine that makes a wide zig-zag stitch

Size 14-18 Denim Sewing Machine needles

1 large spool of thread (at least 1200 yards) to blend with your fabrics, filled bobbins to compliment fabrics

An extension table or any type of extension setup for your sewing machine to give the rug an even surface to rest after it is sewn... this is one of the ways to help the rug not to curl when assembling it

A rug gripper for the bottom of your rug will your completed jelly roll rug

BEFORE the class:

Please have all of your strips joined edge to edge sewn diagonally into one very long strip (approximately 1,700 inches). Strips can easily be daisy-chained. There is no right or wrong way to join your strips. The pattern for the rug can be designed by joining light strips to darker strips (you can assemble it starting either with the dark or the light strips) or you can mix and match your strips depending on your vision of your rug.

Also, you should have your 1 ¹/₄" of batting cut into 2 ¹/₂" strips and joined to make one very long strip of batting **OR** your pre-cut batting strip rolls ready.

We will start our class by joining the batting strip within the very long fabric strip to create the fabric/ batting tubes.

LOUCON ANNUAL RETREAT Thurs Nov 2nd 9 AM CST – Sun, Nov 5th 2 PM CST

Loucon Retreat is open to all Stitchers in good standing. Loucon Retreat Center is a multi-use, rustic campground with a larger building that we completely occupy, located outside Leitchfield, KY. Bedrooms, located downstairs, have 2 queen beds and 1 upper bunk. Each bedroom has 1 private bathroom. Maximum occupancy is 3 persons per room. No pets nor children.

Each attendee brings their own bedroom, bathroom linens/supplies – TP is provided. The great room upstairs is our shared sewing room. Sewing areas have a long table for each attendee. There are community raised cutting tables and ironing boards. Attendees will have a long table to set up their own machine, cutting area and ironing area, as attendee wants. There is room for each Stitcher to bring one additional sewing machine table set perpendicular to the provided table, if wanted. Chairs are provided. Chair pad/pillow is encouraged to be brought by attendee. Machines, fabric, notions, etc. are brought by each Stitcher-please label your items.

Day trips to Bee Positive and Whittles quilt shops are close enough to visit but not required.

There are beautiful trails to walk on the grounds. The building is secured each night. There is an off-load area downstairs for your room gear and upper drop off area for your sewing gear. Parking is adjacent and in close proximity to the building.

Eight meals will be eaten together in the Loucon dining hall, except Saturday night when we go to a local Mexican restaurant. Those meals to be: Thurs. dinner; Fri breakfast, lunch, dinner; Sat breakfast & lunch; Sun breakfast and lunch. There maybe other groups sharing the dining hall.

Total Cost: \$170.00 per person. Flat rate.

Payments, after a \$25 deposit to save your spot, can be paid monthly but needs to be totally paid by October 1, 2023



Minutes of Club Meeting – Stitchers Quilt Guild Date of Meeting: January 25, 2023 Place: Hardin County Cooperative Extension Time of Meeting: 6:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order by President Barbara Dixon, she welcomed 26 members and 1 guest Kathryn LaRoche. Due to a Covid outbreak, President Dixon said the UFO Challenge Quilts would be due at the February meeting.

Approval of Minutes – The minutes were emailed out prior to the meeting Amy Labriola moved for the minutes to be approved as presented, seconded by Anne Aubrey. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer's report – The Treasurer's report was emailed out earlier, as there was no discussion the report will be filed for audit.

Report of Officers and Standing Committees:

President: Barbara Dixon thanked everyone for helping with the Christmas dinner. She commented that Carla Harold is an excellent planner! She went on to thank Patty Pruitt for a wonderful Bargello class held the week-end of January 20-21. She informed the group that the next Homemaker lesson would be held at the Hardin County Extension building. The topic was "Elements and Principles of Art". All Stitchers are welcome to attend. The class will be Friday, January 27 at 1:30 in the Sewing Room. Barbara said she would try to send out some additional information on the lesson. Barbara reminded the members that they might want to think about applying for one of the Stitcher mini grants. She explained that several grants are available to all Stitchers. To qualify a candidate must fill out a form for a quilt related class, and be selected by a committee. In return the Stitcher needs to share with the membership during a club meeting something learned at the workshop. She mentioned that there are a limited number of mini grants available. A need for a phone tree was discussed. Anne Aubrey volunteered to head up a committee of about 10 to get this started. Other volunteers: Kathryn LaRoche, Pat Sego, Marlene Ruby-Suarez, Amy Labriola, Mary Lois Hill, and Paula Sifferd.

2nd Vice President: Vonnie Ryan – Absent, but sent in the following report: LOUCON: Beginning signups and deposits are beginning tonight. Loucon is our annual sewing retreat at the rustic camp outside Leitchfield – about 45 minutes from E-town. There's room for 24 Stitchers. The cost is a flat rate of \$170 for room and meals. Thursday, November 2 @ 9AM (slow time) to Sunday, November 5 @ 2PM ... except Sat dinner at a local Mexican restaurant – at attendees own cost. There's more information on the handouts. A \$25 deposit will hold your reservation. Please any discussion of costs, splitting costs can be held at the Feb Stitcher meeting. BUS TO PADUCAH QUILT SHOW: We have a large bus reservation to the Paducah AQS Quilt Show on Thur, April 27th – leaving the Hardin County Extension Office approx. 7AM, driving to Hancock's and then to the quilt show. The bus holds 48. Our guild voted that 35 seats need to be reserved or the bus trip is canceled. To date 9 have paid the \$25 for the trip. The \$25 will be refunded to riders that volunteered at least 3 hours at the 2022 Heartland of Kentucky Quilt Show...so the cost will be free to ride. Admission to the AQS is your responsibility. There are other groups requesting to ride with us. Our guild members take precedence over non-members. However, admittance will be opened to non members beginning Feb 1, as agreed previously @ \$50 per rider. It's going to be fun!!!
