ELIZIBETHTOWN STITCHERS QUILT GUILD OFFICER ELECTIONS

It's that time again! We have 3 officer positions that we will be having elections for. They are 1st VP, 2nd VP and Secretary. We will need a chairperson for this. Nominees are presented in March and elections are in April. Nominations from the floor will be accepted on election day. Election is by printed ballot with space allowed for write-ins. A 2-year membership in the Stitcher's Quilt Guild is required to run for office. All newly elected officers will assume office on July 1.

FIRST VICE PRESIDENT:

- Presides over monthly Guild meetings in the absence of the President.
- Coordinates activities for the monthly meetings.
- Assumes duties of the Second Vice-President in his/her absence.
- Maintains inventory of door prizes to include cost, date purchased and date given at meeting.
- Serves as Chairperson of the Mini-Grant committee.

SECOND VICE PRESIDENT:

- Second in line to preside over monthly Guild meetings in the absence of the President. Secures instructors and facilities for classes and workshops.
- Coordinates activities outside of monthly meetings, ex: retreats, shop hops, etc.

SECRETARY:

- Records the minutes of the general membership and Executive Board meetings and is required to have them available at all meetings.
- Shall carry on the correspondence of the Guild including thank you notes, condolences, and get-well notes.
- Shall furnish a copy of all business sessions to the County Extension Agent.
- Shall maintain a membership roster and distribute it to members and the County Extension Agent.
- Shall distribute membership kits for new members.
- Shall inform Email Administrator of all new members.
- Shall submit article on Guild events to KHQS for publication in their newsletter.
