



### STEP 1

Start early tracking your participation in activities, events, and any awards received.

### STEP 2

Download or Print an Achievement Application from https:// hardin.ca.uky.edu/sites/ hardin.ca.uky.edu/files/PY24% 20Achievement%20Application.pdf

### STEP 3

Complete your Achievement Profile located on page 2 of the Achievement Application if you are a Bronze, Silver or Gold applicant.

### STEP 4

Turn in your completed application with Profile Page and any other required documents to your agent by the deadline Monday, September 30, 2024.



### **NEXT STEPS:**

Applications will be forwarded to the district level for judging if applicable. Results are not known for several months. However, review your application and start setting goals for the next program year!

1 cup sugar

¼ cup vegetable oil

¼ cup plus 2 tablespoons applesauce

2 eggs

¾ cup all-purpose flour

3/4 cup whole-wheat flour

1/4 teaspoon salt

½ teaspoon baking soda

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

½ teaspoon ground nutmeg or allspice

¼ cup grated zucchini

1/4 cup grated carrots

¼ cup raisins

1/4 cup chopped pecans (optional)

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F.
- 2. Grease muffin pans with cooking spray or use paper liners.
- 3. In a medium bowl, beat sugar, oil, applesauce, and eggs until well blended.
- **4.** Sift together flours, salt, baking soda, baking powder, cinnamon and nutmeg.
- 5. Add flour mixture to sugar mixture, mixing all ingredients just until moistened (there will still be lumps).
- **6.** Gently fold in zucchini, carrots, raisins and pecans into the batter.
- 7. Fill muffin pans <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> full and bake for 20 to 25 minutes.
